

Boosting Sewerage Treatment through Yamuna Action Plan Project (III)

On July 8, 2019, the ground-breaking ceremony of 564 Million Litres per Day (MLD) Sewerage Treatment Plant (STP) supported by JICA was held at Okhla, New Delhi, under the Yamuna Action Plan Project (III). The objective of the Project is to augment sewage treatment capacity by constructing and renovating Sewage Treatment Plants and sewer lines for improved sanitary conditions of the residents. The STP is expected to treat the sewage generated by around 4 million people of Delhi.

Mr. Arvind Kejriwal, Hon'ble Chief Minister, Government of the National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi and Chairman of Delhi Jal Board (DJB) and Mr. Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, Hon'ble Minister of Jal Shakti Ministry, Government of India (GOI) inaugurated the construction of the STP. The inauguration ceremony was also attended by Mr. Nikhil Kumar, CEO, DJB; Mr. Kenko Sone, Minister (Economic & Development), Embassy of Japan and Mr. Katsuo Matsumoto, Chief Representative, JICA India, amongst other dignitaries.

Speaking on the occasion, Mr. Katsuo Matsumoto, Chief Representative, JICA India said, "JICA has supported construction of STPs and related sewage facilities since 1992 for water quality improvement of Yamuna River. JICA's cumulative support for Okhla STPs is expected to treat more than 20% of wastewater discharged by Delhi citizens. I hope that the plant becomes a good case of high quality infrastructure infused with advanced technologies and great magnitude."




Seven New JICA Volunteers Deployed to India for Sharing their Knowledge and Experience

On August 1, 2019, Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) deployed 7 new volunteers to India to promote international cooperation through the sharing of knowledge and experience and to work as a bridge between the people of India and Japan. With these new volunteers, widely known as Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers (JOCVs), India has a total of 18 volunteers in as many as 10 states which are Telangana, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Odisha, Himachal Pradesh, Gujarat, Delhi, West Bengal, Uttarakhand and Andhra Pradesh.

Promoting Capacity Development for Railway Safety by Visiting Rolling Stock Maintenance Facilities under Technical Cooperation Project



On August 1, 2019, under the ongoing Technical Corporation (TC) Project 'Capacity Development on Railway Safety', which aims to enhance the capacity of the Indian Railways (IR) and the Dedicated Freight Corridor Corporation of India Limited (DFCCIL), JICA Experts visited Rolling Stock Maintenance facilities to have knowledge sharing with Indian counterparts in order to deepen mutual understanding of methodology for Rolling Stock maintenance in India and Japan.

JICA Experts visited Electric Multiple Unit (EMU) Car Shed in Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh and Carriage & Wagon Workshop in Jagadhari, Haryana to understand Rolling Stock maintenance practices and actual maintenance status of running gear (bogie/wheelset) to promote improved maintenance quality on Rolling Stock in Indian Railways.

Speaking on the occasion Mr. Takuo Kuwahara, JICA Expert for Rolling Stock Maintenance said, "During the site survey, JICA Experts team had a discussion with Indian counterparts on details of the forthcoming training program of Indian officials in Japan scheduled in November 2019, besides the Rolling Stock maintenance practices followed in India. JICA Expert team will frame training program based on the mutual understanding with Indian counterparts. We believe that tailor-made training program in Japan would be a good opportunity for Indian counterparts to understand Japanese knowledge and experiences so as to contribute to the safe railway operation in India." This TC project is to be implemented during the next one and half years. The first training program in Japan in the field of Accident Investigation was conducted in early July 2019. Another four training programs in Japan in the field of Rolling Stock maintenance, Rail welding, Track maintenance, Safety Management will be conducted within the current fiscal year 2019.

Second Bamboo Workshop to Boost Production and Value Chain Management in North East States

On August 9, 2019, the one-day workshop on "Production and Industrial Use of Bamboo: Issues, Prospects and Challenges" was held in Tripura. After the first workshop which was held in August 2018 with a focus on bamboo handicrafts, this second workshop focuses on expansion in production, industrial use and value chain management of bamboo. JICA has been extending the ODA loan to Tripura state in implementation of forestry projects and "The Project for Sustainable Catchment Forest Management", launched in 2018.

Mr. Biplab Kumar Deb, Hon'ble Chief Minister, Tripura; Dr. U. Venkateswarlu, Chief Secretary, Tripura and Mr. Mevar Kumar Jamatia, Hon'ble Forest Minister, Tripura delivered their opening remarks as the Chief Guests. Professor Shozo Shibata from Kyoto University was invited as the special guest speaker, spoke about his research outcomes on bamboo species in Mizoram state as well as the opportunities for collaboration between Japan and India in the bamboo sector. In addition to the Government officials and Japanese representatives, many experts and practitioners of the sector addressed the audience on both production and value addition aspects.

Speaking at the occasion, Mr. Toru Uemachi, Senior Representative of JICA India said, "Reflecting the policy of both governments, JICA will continue collaborating with states in capacity building of people utilizing bamboos as well as vigorously exploring the possibilities in improving value chains and in connecting the Indian and Japanese business in the bamboo sector.

Dispatching JICA Experts for Railway Safety Management and Track Maintenance under Technical Cooperation Project






On August 9, 2019, under the ongoing JICA Technical Corporation (TC) Project 'Capacity Development on Railway Safety, in continuation with site survey of Rolling Stock Maintenance conducted last week, JICA Experts for Railway Safety Management and Track Maintenance implemented site survey with Indian counterparts this week in order to deepen mutual understanding of methodology and practice for Safety Management and Track maintenance in India and Japan.

JICA expert team for Railway Safety Management visited New Delhi Railway Station and Indian Railways Institute of Transport Management in Lucknow to understand the actual procedures of works carried out in station area and attended the seminar on safety management meant for Railway's Chief Safety Officers to exchange views on the forthcoming training program in Japan. Parallelly, JICA Expert team for track maintenance visited Operation Control Office in Delhi, Training Centre in Ghaziabad, and Station/Yard tracks in Ghaziabad, Tughlakabad and Ambala to observe track condition and discussed the status of the quality of track maintenance work and issues for improvement of Indian Railways.

Speaking on the occasion Dr. Makoto Ishida, Chief Advisor of JICA expert team who led site survey of Track Maintenance in this week said, "Indian side requested to be informed of the better practice of track maintenance under limited track possession time efficiently. In this site survey, the idea of improvement regarding track maintenance in Indian Railways has been identified. Track maintenance group training program in Japan scheduled in October this year will be organized based on our discussion. We hope that this training program in Japan serves as a good opportunity for Indian Railways officials to understand Japanese knowledge and experience and to draft their


Mr. Vineet Sahai Sarin
